Introduction:

A-Level European History consists of two components. You completed Components 1 and 2 when you took AS Level History (U.S. History and International History). The A-Level consists of Components 3 and 4.

Component 4 is a Depth Study on "Europe of the Dictators, 1919 – 1941" We will cover three of the European Dictators: Mussolini, Stalin and Hitler, starting in late September or early October.

Component 3 is a study of the Holocaust, with the focus on how historians treat the subject in their writings. This is a Historiographical look at the Holocaust; it asks students to read an extract by a historian and determine their view concerning the Holocaust or different aspects of it. This summer assignment is an introduction to some of the authors we will encounter while studying both the Holocaust and the Historiography of the Holocaust.

Directions:

Look at the list of six (6) Holocaust authors on the following page. Go to Amazon.com and enter the name of the author and the title of the book.

Each selection has a "Look Inside" feature above a picture of the book. You can click on this feature and read parts of the book. There is no need to purchase anything.

You should read at least the 8 to 12 pages of text in the introduction or later chapter(s). This feature "Look Inside" usually includes forewords, introductions and a table of contents. Scroll through until you find content on the Holocaust.

Start reading. You are looking for the main topic of the book, how the author is treating the subject and any relevant historic information. After reading the passage, answer the questions on the next page.

Finally, do not worry if some pages are missing in this "Look Inside" feature.

Answer the following questions for each of the six authors/books.

Questions:

- 1. What is the main purpose of this book?
- 2. What does the author say about causes of the Holocaust?
- 3. According to the author, what was the role of Hitler in the Holocaust?
- 4. What are your personal observations concerning this book and the author?
