Door decorating By Monday teachers who plan to participate in the door decorating contest should have their doors decorated by Monday. A team of judges will go from hall to hall and judge the doors using a rubric. The contest winner will be announced on Friday.

Character Day: Students will have the option to dress as a character for the day. In order to wear the costume, the student must check in with their English teacher or with Ms. Rimel in the media center and they will be given a sticker that says "Who am I?" They must wear this sticker to be allowed to participate. If they wish to enter the costume contest, they can stop by the media center and have their photo taken. The photos will be on display in the media center following the event, and a team will vote on the winner.

Hats on for Reading: To raise money for a local literacy charity (the actual charity is being researched) students will have the opportunity to pay \$1 to wear a hat during literacy week. The students in hats will help serve as symbols to spread the word of literacy in our school.

Open Mike Reading: Students will be able to showcase their writing talents by submitting a piece to be read during an open mike session. If their piece is approved, they will be given a time slot to come to the auditorium and read their piece.

Read-A-Thon: Prominent members of the community will be invited to come and read a piece of literature that has "changed their world." Members will be invited in from various fields like Aerospace and Education to read their pieces.

Speed Book Talk: Much like speed dating, this structure will involve centers in the media center where students will do a "book talk" on a novel they've read in 60 seconds or less. For this event, classes can sign up to take part in the structure where students who have not read the novels discussed will rotate through the "speed book talks."
