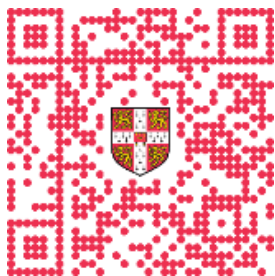

Dual Enrollment

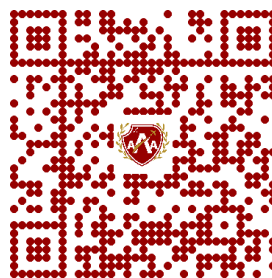
The Dual Enrollment program allows admitted students to complete a full 60 credits of dual enrollment coursework, culminating in earning both a standard high school diploma as well as an Associate of Arts (AA) Degree upon the completion of four years of high school.

St. Johns County Academy of Future Teachers



This academy explores careers in the field of education using service learning, cutting-edge technology, and full year internships. Fostering the next generation of educators, the program focuses on developing student leaders who will be the next caring contributors to the children of the future. Placing academic success at the forefront of the program, qualifying students have the opportunity for dual enrollment credits from St. Johns River State College or the University of North Florida through the Virtual Teaching Academy. Students can earn industry certification such as WordPress Certified Editor and FCTE Professional Educator.

St. Johns County Aerospace Academy



In partnership with Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, St. Augustine High School offers an introduction to STEM careers in Aviation and Aerospace. Students choose between two unique strands. Aviation Maintenance offers pathways to post-secondary employment in the field of aviation. Students receive technical training to prepare for careers such as A&P Mechanic and Aviation Maintenance Technician. Students will learn by building drones and trouble shooting aircraft components. Aerospace Studies offers as many as 12 hours of dual enrollment credits from Embry-Riddle. Students can earn industry certifications in USI Small Unmanned Aircraft Safety,

Visual Line of Sight System Operator (VSO), and FAA Private Pilot. In both strands, students learn the basic math and science necessary for aviation fields, have opportunities to explore space flight by building and launching rockets, learn to fly using flight simulators, and learn how to program and operate professional grade drones.

Academy of Law and Homeland Security



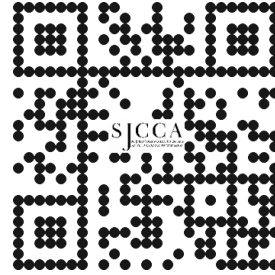
This program introduces students to the various academic and career opportunities in Law, Law Enforcement, and other Homeland Security related fields. With the support of the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office and other law agencies, students get authentic learning experiences through field studies, guest speakers, and internships. Possible industry certifications include 911 dispatcher, private security guard, police service aide, and certified legal assistant. Students also have Dual Enrollment opportunities through St. Johns River State College.

The Early Career Program

The First Coast Technical College (FCTC) Early Career Dual Enrollment Program outlines the path for qualified students to complete career dual enrollment coursework culminating in both a high school diploma as well as career specific. Licensure or certification upon completing four years of high school. Ninth grade offers an accelerated high school course progression working towards an 18 credit CTE diploma. Tenth and eleventh grade students follow a dual enrollment

schedule at FCTC, in combination with remaining high school courses at SAHS as needed for completion of diploma requirements. Twelve grade students complete their dual enrollment at FCTC along with work-based learning, on the job training, and/or professional internship.

St. Johns County Center for the Arts (SJCCA)



SJCCA provides artistically gifted students with a pre-professional program of study designed to develop their unique talents in the performing and visual arts. SJCCA students must audition before being accepted into the Academy. The following programs are offered in SJCCA: Band, Ceramics, Chorus, Dance, Digital Art, Drawing and Painting, Guitar, Drama, Musical Theatre, and Piano.

Army Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC)



JROTC is a cooperative effort between the US Army and SAHS. This program can lead to advanced rank in the Armed Forces. The curriculum teaches each cadet good citizenship, leadership, the ability to communicate effectively, the importance of physical fitness and the importance of a high school diploma for a successful future.
