ACT, SAT, PSAT and Advanced Placement are national standardized tests that your student may take while attending high school. The American College Testing Board and the College Board govern these tests. While your student may have accommodations when taking state and local tests, these accommodations will not be granted on ACT, SAT, PSAT and Advanced Placement unless you apply for accommodations through the College Board and the American College Testing websites.

You are able to apply for the accommodations for your student at the web address below, or you can request that our staff at SAHS complete the requests. Once you apply for accommodations through The American College Testing Board and the College Board, and accommodations are approved, they will be good for the entire time your student is in high school. If you would like the school to request accommodations on ACT, SAT, PSAT or Advanced Placement Tests, you must complete the following release of records form(s) and return them to Ms. Kristin Jasper, Testing Coordinator, or SAHS guidance.

National accommodations aren't guaranteed to be the same as the accommodations received in the IEP or 504 plan. The College Board and the American College Testing board review the individual student IEP and determine the eligibility for accommodations. The process usually takes approximately 60 days. So, please be sure to submit your request early!

PSAT is taken in 10th grade during the school day and students may sign up to take this test during 9th or 11th grade. The PSAT is the Pre-SAT and is a preparation for the SAT and it can be used for some scholarships such as National Merit Scholarship. The SAT and ACT are both taken outside of the normal school day and students must sign up for those tests. Advanced Placement Tests are in the Spring of each year and will take place during the school day. For test dates and information, please have your student visit guidance to pick up test date information as well as study guide information.
