Introduction:

A-Level European History consists of two components: Component 3 (Interpretation Questions) and Component 4, a Depth Study on "Europe of the Dictators, 1919 – 1941" We will cover three of the European Dictators: Mussolini, Stalin and Hitler, starting in late September or early October.

Component 3 is a study of the Holocaust; the focus is on how historians treat the subject in their writings. This is a Historiographical look at the Holocaust. Component 3 (or Paper 3) asks students to read and analyze an extract to determine the Historian's interpretation and approach to the subject. Successful analysis for Paper 3 requires both Holocaust content knowledge and practice analyzing Extracts by different Holocaust authors. The summer assignment introduces you to some of the authors we will encounter studying the Holocaust.

<u>Interpretation: Causes of the Holocaust</u>

One focus of the Holocaust study is "Causes of the Holocaust" and specifically the role of Hitler and other people, in ordering it. There are three (3) theories you should look for when reading:

Intentionalism – interpretations that assume Hitler and the Nazi's planned to exterminate the Jews from the start.

Structuralism – interpretations that argue it was the nature of the Nazi state that produced genocide. There was no coherent plan; instead, the chaotic competition for Hitler's approval between different Nazi leaders produced a situation that resulted in the Holocaust (genocide).

Functionalism – closely related to structuralism. Interpretation that sees the Holocaust as an unplanned, ad hoc response to wartime developments in Eastern Europe (1941 invasion of USSR), when Germany conquered areas with large Jewish populations.

Synthesis – Interpretations that show characteristics of more than one of the above.

A variety of Extracts are used for Paper 3, with many different topics and interpretations. The "Causes of the Holocaust" is only one of many possible topics; I'm providing these terms now so you will be familiar with them as you complete the assigned readings.

Directions:

Look at the list of five (5) Holocaust authors on the following page. Go to <u>Amazon.com</u> and enter the name of the author and the title of the book. Click on the book and look for a feature called "Look Inside" (it's usually located on the 'top' of the picture of the book). Clink on this feature; locate the section you should read (see List on next page). This handy Amazon tab means you can read portions of each book without buying it. \odot

Read the suggested section – it's usually the introduction or foreword. You are looking for the main topic of the book, how the author treats the subject and any relevant historic information. After reading the passage, answer the questions (see #1-4 – below).

Questions:

- 1. What is the main purpose of the book?
- 2. What does the author say about causes of the Holocaust?
- 3. According to the author, what was the role of Hitler in the Holocaust?
- 4. What are your personal observations concerning this book and the author? (Would you want to read more about this books and/or authors?)

Finally, don't worry if some pages (in the "Look Inside" feature) are missing. You will be able to read enough to answer the questions.

The Assignment:

Type up your findings, by Author/Book, answering all four questions for each author. Bring your typed answers to class when school starts in August. Tentative plans are to cover this sometime during the first two weeks of school, however a specific date will be provided later.
