SAHS Tardy Policy

- JACKETS RUN ON TIME: You are officially tardy once the bell has rung. Classroom doors will be closed and locked at the tardy bell.
- If you are tardy, report to the nearest tardy SWIPE machine for a pass.
- You must have a pass to enter class after the tardy bell. Tardy machines are located at the top of B, E, and G Hallways. They are also located at the Bottom of B, C, E Hallways.
 - Since machines are on every hall, if you arrive more than 4 minutes after the time stamped on your pass, you may be considered skipping.



SAHS Tardy Progression

TARDINESS PROGRESSIVE DISCIPLINE:

- 4th TARDY: Conference with Dean
- 5th TARDY: Lunch Detention
- 6th TARDY: Lunch Detention (2 Days)
- 7th TARDY: Before School Detention
- 8th TARDY: ISS or loss of privileges
- o 9th Tardy: ISS 1 Day
- 10th Tardy: ISS 2 Days

Additional Consequences for Drivers
4 Tardies to 1st period of the day – Counseled by Dean
5 Tardies to 1st period of the day – Loss of parking tag for 5 days
6 Tardies to 1st period of the day – Loss of parking tag for 10 days
7 tardies to 1st period of the day – Loss of parking tag for 15 days.

- Tardies are cumulative. Meaning, you could get 4 tardies in one day and receive your first consequence.
- Tardies reset each quarter.

Bell to Bell Instruction


Thank you for not packing up prior to the bell ringing. The bell does not dismiss you. The teacher dismisses you.




DRESS CODE

- SAHS follows the dress code outlined in the SJCSD "Student Code of Conduct". Information below is quoted from the Code of Conduct.
- Skin should be covered from armpit to armpit down to the mid thigh. There should be no exposed skin at the midriff area.
- Sunglasses are not permitted in the building, but can be worn outside. Hats, bandanas, and hoodies are not permitted inside the building.
- Clothing, piercings, and accessories displaying profanity, violence, discriminatory messages, sexually suggestive phrases, phrases or symbols of alcohol, tobacco, or drugs is unacceptable and will result in corrective action.



DRESS CODE Continued

- Students will be asked to report to the dean's office to change clothes if in violation of the SJCSD Dress Code. Students may return to class after changing.
 - Zipping up a jacket or putting on a sweatshirt does not qualify as a change of clothes.
- Failure to report to the Dean's office for a dress code violation is a Level 2 offense and will result in out of school suspension.
- Please consult a dean or administration for any questions regarding the SJCSD dress code.



Attendance


- For absences: please make sure a note is submitted to the dean's office.

- Schoology will be the platform you to access assignments for all of your coursework.

MAXIMIZING INSTRUCTION

Our cellphone policy is designed to maximize instruction and minimize distractions. Thank you for cooperating....TOGETHER!

CELLPHONES

- Cell phones can serve as a sever distraction to instruction
- Upon entering every classroom, phones are required to be silent and placed in the cellphone pouches.
 - Students in violation will have their phone confiscated and will receive discipline consequences
 - Failure to turn over your cellphone when in violation of our policies is a Level 2 offense and will receive immediate suspension
 - Headphones/airpods are not allowed in the classroom.
- Phones must remain in pouches when out on hall passes. Phones are not allowed in the hallway during class time.
 - Phones will be confiscated, and students will receive discipline consequences if in violation of this policy.
- Phones allowed before school, during transitions, lunch, and after school
 - One earbud at all times for headphones





Clinic

- You MUST have a pass to go to the clinic with the exception of major health emergencies.
- The clinic DOES NOT supply chapstick, lotions, cough drops or medication unless provided by your parent/guardian along with a medication consent form which can be found online or in the health office.

MAXIMIZING INSTRUCTION

Our hall pass policy is designed to maximize instruction time and minimize distractions. Thank you for cooperating....TOGETHER!

HALL PASSES

- It is a research-based fact that students learn more when they are in class. Our hall pass policy is designed to maximize time spent in class.
- Only 1 student out of class at a time. Students use their lanyard pass.
 - Hang your pass on the screws outside the restroom. If all hooks are taken, wait for someone to leave before entering the restroom.
- Students are required to use the nearest restroom to their classroom
 - Passes are color coded to match which bathroom you will go to. Example: B Hall "Blue" will go to the top of B hall near media center to use the restroom.
- Students who are "out of area" can be considered "skipping
- Remember: No cell phones allowed in the hall during class time

IDs

- All students must have a school ID readily available.
- This can be either your hard copy ID or a digital ID on your phone.
- Download the Leonard's app using the directions on this slide.
- IDs will be used for lunch, textbook and materials checkout of The Hub, and to print your tardy pass from the Swipe machine.



LUNCH

- Students can eat lunch in the cafeteria, in the courtyard, media center (starting after Labor Day), or in a teacher's room with an "orange" pass.
- Students may use their phones during their lunch time and may use one earbud.
- After the month, the Media Center will share their practices for getting passes to eat lunch there.
- Wherever you choose to be during lunch, leave it clean, and help keep our campus beautiful and clean.
- Lunch assignments are by 4th period class.
- The courtyard doors to the main hall must remain closed until lunch dismissal
- At dismissal, proceed directly to your class.






Acceptable Use Policy (AUP)



Phones/electronics

- All phones MUST be turned in to the hanging pouch located in each teacher's classroom.
- Phones may be used during transition, before school, and lunch.
 - Only one earbud my be in so you can still hear others.
- May NOT be used during classroom time without teacher permission.
- Infractions will result in immediate consequences including confiscation of your device(s).

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Restroom

*Any students found loitering in any bathroom may be subject to search via Florida Statute 1006.09.

- You are encouraged to use the restroom during transition times.
- While in class, you must:
 - Gain permission from your teacher.
 - Grab a hall pass (only two out at a time).
 - Use the restroom assigned to your class. They will all be color coordinated. (EX: pink pass, pink restroom...)
 - Phone possession or talking while out on a pass is prohibited.
 - Hang pass on the outside of the restroom. If there are no available hooks, wait outside for someone to exit.
 - Return pass to class.

Any "wandering" or out of area will result in immediate consequences!



Reminder: No socialization or cell-phone use in the hallways. You MUST use your restroom assigned to this pass. If you report to another bath outside area, cor will be ÌQ

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Attendance

- Florida state law dictates students must regularly attend school.
- When absent, turn in all notes to the student services office immediately upon return.
 - Must include your name, reason, and student ID.
- Multiple absences will require a doctor's note and may trigger a truancy investigation involving the county circuit court.
- Multiple absences may result in mandatory court appearances and loss of driver's license.



Tardy

- All classroom doors will close and lock at each bell.
- If you're late, you MUST:
 - Immediately get a tardy pass from the closest SWYPE machine.
 - Go straight to class and present pass to teacher.
 - Failure to report directly to class after receiving a tardy pass will result in disciplinary action.
- YES, two seconds or two minutes, you're still late.
- NO, "My stuff was already in the room" does not count.



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Tardy consequences

Tardiness consequences

- 4th tardy = conference with dean
- 5th tardy = lunch detention
- 6th tardy = lunch detention (2 days)
- 7th tardy = Before school detention
- 8th tardy = Period of ISS
- 9th tardy = ISS 1 day
- 10th tardy = ISS 2 days
- 11+ tardy = ISS/loss of consequences

Additional consequences for drivers

- 4 tardies to 1st period of the day counseled by Dean
- 5 tardies to 1st period of the day Loss of parking tag for 5 days
- 6 Tardies to 1st period of the day Loss of parking tag for 10 days
- 7 tardies to 1st period of the day Loss of parking tag for 15 days

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• 8+ tardies to 1st period of the parking tag may be revoked for extended amount of time.


Lunch


- During your lunch period, you may eat in the cafeteria or courtyard only.
- You may only eat during your designated lunch period.
- You are expected to arrive to lunch on time as well as your class when lunch dismisses.
- You may NOT leave campus, go to vehicles or roam during your lunch.
- Absolutely NO third-party delivery to campus (i.e., Uber eats/door dash). All items will be confiscated.



Dress Code

- Armpit to mid-thigh must be covered.
- Top must have straps.
- Nothing that displays violence, discriminatory messages, sexually suggestive images, alcohol, tobacco, or drugs
- NO:
 - Pajamas
 - Head gear, hoods, or sunglasses in building
 - Slippers





Entering and Exiting the building

- You may enter or exit the building though any door before or after school hours.
- During school hours (9:20 am 3:55 pm MTRF or 9:20 am 2:55 pm on Wednesday), you may only use the front entrance doors to enter or exit the school building.
 - Yes, If you leave or arrive to school during normal school hours, you MUST use the front entrance only.
- Any student violating this policy or opening anyone attempting to enter the building d will be subject to immediate consequence




