CELL PHONES

- WHEN CAN YOU USE THEM?
- WHEN CAN'T YOU USE THEM?

STUDENTS THAT ARE FOUND WITH CELL PHONES IN THE HALLWAY DURING CLASS INSTRUCTION TIME, WILL BE TAKEN TO THE DEAN'S OFFICE.

EXAMPLE: Student is leaving campus but was meeting with a teacher before leaving campus. Once the tardy bell rings for 5th period (example), CELL PHONES in the hallway must not be in use or seen.

EXAMPLE: Student is late for 5th period (example), and student is casually grabbing a tardy slip and texting. This is in violation due to class being in session.



Field Study Criteria to ATTEND

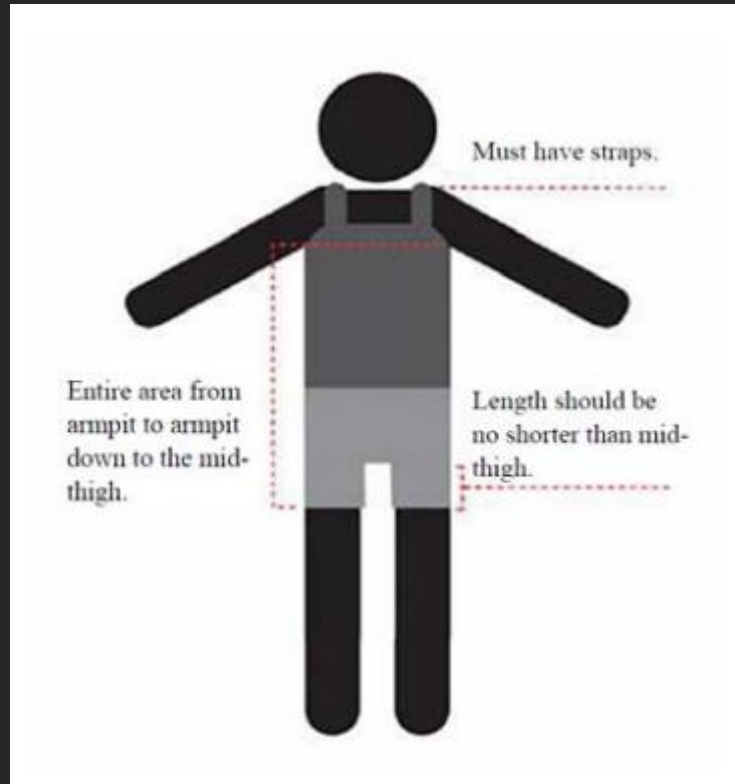
-  **Students are encouraged to maintain strong attendance!**
To stay eligible for special events and opportunities, students should **avoid being placed on the truancy list** by attending school regularly and arriving on time.
 -  **Keep up your grades!**
To stay eligible for field studies and special events, students should **maintain a C or higher in all current classes**. Make sure your gradebook reflects your hard work and academic success!
 -  **Show Positive Behavior!**
Students demonstrate readiness for special events by:
 - Maintaining **no more than 2 days of In-School Suspension (ISS)**
 - Maintaining **no more than 2 days of Out-of-School Suspension (OSS)** or a **combined total of 2 days ISS/OSS**
 - Having **no Level 3 discipline offenses** in the current semester
 - Having **no Level 4 discipline offenses** during the current school year
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EARBUDS

- 1 EAR ONLY for SAFETY!

No AI Use During Tests or Written Assignments

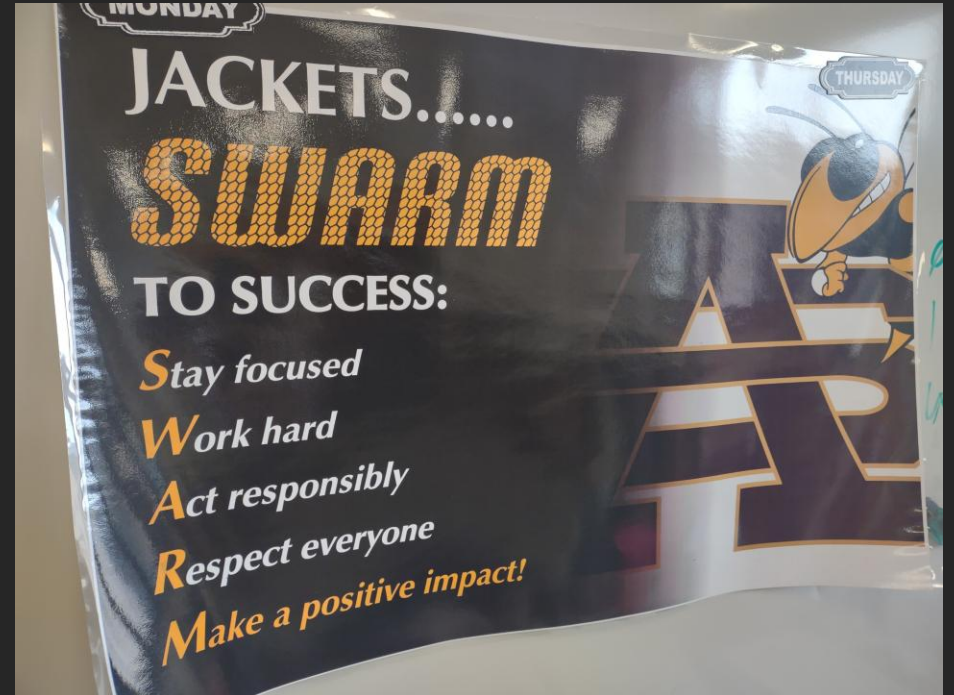

- These assignments are meant to reflect **your own understanding and skills**. Using AI during these tasks is considered **academic dishonesty** and will result in disciplinary action.
-  **What's okay:**
 - Using AI for brainstorming, studying, or reviewing material **outside of testing situations**.
-  **What's not okay:**
 - Copying AI-generated answers during tests
 - Creating photos or images using AI without written consent
 - Submitting AI-written responses for graded assignments
 - Using AI to bypass learning or critical thinking

Let's keep our learning authentic and our integrity strong. If you're unsure whether AI use is appropriate for a task, **ask your teacher first**.

The Use of profanity or derogatory language...

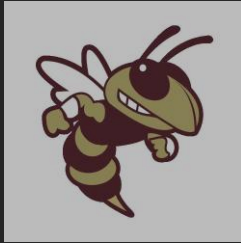
